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## **Powelton Owners Ask U. S. to Halt University City Aid**

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The Powelton Civic Home Owners Association yesterday asked the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to hold up all money for redevelopment of University Unit 5 pending a hearing before HUD officials.

The association is charging that Drexel Institute of Technology, developer, for the unit, is violating a federal law because its redevelopment plan does not provide for the total community, but only for Drexel.

The citizen group wants Drexel to spare about 50 homes in the two block area bounded by 34<sup>th</sup>, 35<sup>th</sup>, Chestnut and Race sts.

Drexel's plan calls for total clearance, according to Arsen Kashkashian, attorney for the association.

"Drexel's plan," said Kashkashian, "violates the spirit and intent of the law which is to provide basically for the total community. We say this area should not be utilized only for the school's purposes.

"They should not be the only recipients of the benefits of the housing act."

Kashkashian said the homeowners will take their flight to federal court if they can get no relief from HUD.

The Redevelopment Authority and the City Planning Commission earlier accepted Drexel's plan and rejected on proposed by the residents, which called for retention of about 50 of the 200 homes in the area.

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
