# Students to Have Cubicles at University City High

Each of the 2,500 to 3,000 pupils who will attend a new Philadelphia public high school will be able to achieve a little solitude.

Individual carrels, or study alcoves, are to be provided for each student, the school board said yesterday.

The board said \$13.7 million in contracts have been awarded for construction of the school, the West Philadelphia-University City high School, at 36<sup>th</sup> and Filbert sts.

The school is scheduled to open in November, 1970 if voters approve the \$90 million school construction bond issue on the May 20 primary ballot.

The new school will be the only one in Pennsylvania and one of 18 in the nation to be designated by the Government as ES '70 schools, which, the board said, means, Educational System for the 1970s.

Under that system, said the board, there are individualized learning packets for each student and extensive changes in teaching concepts.

The school will also serve as a "magnet school" in science and mathematics, with eventual enrollment to be drawn from throughout the city. Cooperation and agreements have been made with the University of Pennsylvania, Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Science and General Electric Reentry Systems department.

The school will be divided into four "houses" of instruction. There will be 56 classrooms and 53 special rooms and laboratories, including the city's first high school isotope and live animal laboratories.
