About 25 West Philadelphia community leaders, most from the Mantua section, demanded yesterday that they may be permitted to share in the selection of the principal of University City High School, scheduled to open in September, 1971.

Group spokesman Andrew Jenkins, director of the Mantua Community Planners, said the protestors thought there “was nothing wrong” with the school board’s selection of Walter Scott, current principal of West Philadelphia High, for the post.

“We just think the community should have been consulted,” Jenkins added.

The group made its complaint to Dr. Marechal-Neil E. Young, superintendent of School District 1 in her offices in the Alain Locke Elementary School, 46th st. and Haverford av.

Jenkins said the group wants the selection process reopened so that a 10-man committee selected by the community could participate in the screening of nominees.

Reached at home, Dr. Mark Shedd, Superintendent of Schools, said the group’s request “is a distinct possibility.”
